COOPERATIVE SERVICE FIELD AGREEMENT Between

City of Sapulpa

UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE ANIMAL AND PLANT HEALTH INSPECTION SERVICE WILDLIFE SERVCIES (WS)

ARTICLE 1

The purpose of this agreement is to cooperate in a wildlife damage control project, as described below:

Removal of Beaver, damaging property and threatening human health and safety, using legal & approved methods (species, location, type of damage, service WS will provide)

ARTICLE 2

Authority exists under the Congressional Act of 1931 (7 USC 426-426b, as amended) and the Rural Development, Agriculture and Related Agencies Appropriation Act, 1988 (P.L. 100-202), to cooperate with states, individuals, public and private agencies, organizations and institutions to control wildlife damage.

ARTICLE 3

WS and the Cooperator agree:

- 1. WS will provide the requested wildlife damage control service.
- 2. The Cooperator will reimburse the U.S. Department of Agriculture the sum of \$\frac{7,500}{2}\$ to cover costs listed below:

Labor, travel and supplies needed to conduct work

(cost of labor, travel, supplies/materials)

- 3. Payment will be made by check payable to U.S. Department of Agriculture by mutually agreed upon date.
- 4. The monies received by WS will be used for wildlife damage control activities and upon termination of the agreement any unexpended funds will be retained by WS.
- 5. Control activities will be conducted in accordance with applicable Federal, State and local laws and regulations.
- 6. Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent any other individual or organization from entering into separate Agreements with WS for the purpose of controlling wildlife damage.

ARTICLE 4

Pursuant to Section 22, title 41, United States Code, no member of Congress shall be admitted to any share or part of the Agreement or to any benefit to arise there from.

ARTICLE 5

WS will hold the Cooperator harmless from any liability arising from the negligent act of omission of a government officer or employee acting within the scope of his or her employment to the extent compensation is available pursuant to the Federal Tort Claims Act (FTCA), 28 USC 2671 et.seq., except to the extent that aforesaid liability arises from the negligent acts or omissions of the Cooperator, his employees, agents or subcontractors). Such relief shall be provided pursuant to the procedures set forth in the FTCA and applicable regulations.

ARTICLE 6

WS has advised the Cooperator that other private sector service providers may be available to provide wildlife management services and notwithstanding these other options, Cooperator requests that WS provide wildlife management services as stated under the terms of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 7

The Agreement shall become effective on October 1st, 2019 and expire on September 30th, 2020. This Agreement may be amended or terminated at any time by mutual agreement of the parties in writing. Further, in the event the Cooperator does not, for any reason, deposit necessary funds, WS is relieved of the obligation to provide services under this Agreement.

To the South of the proposed dispensary is "Cambridge Court" apartment complex. According to the Comprehensive Plan, the South half of the commercial area has a residential designation. It is staff's recommendation that we extend the office/commercial designation approximately 378 feet to the South. This amendment would bring the commercial area into compliance with the Comprehensive Plan.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Sapulpa Planning Commission met on October 22nd, 2019, and voted 4-2 to recommend approval of the application to City Council. Staff concurs with the recommendation.

BACKGROUND:

A medical marijuana dispensary license allows a business to legally sell medical marijuana and medical marijuana products. Licensed dispensaries can only sell to patient license holders, caregiver license holders, research license holders, and the parent or legal guardian named on a minor patient's license. Dispensaries engaging in unlawful sales may be fined, or their licenses may be revoked. Licensed dispensaries must comply with Title 63 O.S. § 420A *et seq.* and the Oklahoma Administrative Code (OAC) 310:681.

The subject property is located at the far west end of a shopping center. Then tenants from east to west are Atwoods, H & R Block, Salon, "Star Care", and Bayouth Insurance office. To the South of the proposed site is an apartment complex, "Cambridge Court".

According to the Comprehensive plan, the south half of the commercial area has a Residential zoning designation. It is staff's recommendation that we extend the office/commercial designation approximately 378 feet to the South. This amendment would bring the commercial area into compliance with the comprehensive plan.



The facility's operation and design shall minimize any impact to adjacent uses, including the control of any odor by maintaining and operating an air filtration system so that no odor is detectable outside of the permitted premises.
- f. All necessary building, electrical, plumbing, and mechanical permits and inspections must be obtained for any part of the permitted premises.
- g. The permit holder, owner and operator of the facility shall use lawful methods in controlling waste or by-products from any activities allowed under the license or permit.







Most of the concern was the proximity to the Courthouse and the wholesale use. The Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend denial of the application. Despite this recommendation for denial, the applicant submitted a timely response and request (attached) that the city council determine the issue.

BACKGROUND:

The processing portion of the application will be a commercial kitchen used to bake edible marijuana products. The applicant is planning to use a "decarboxylated" product in her baking. According to research by staff, this will virtually eliminate the odor of marijuana processing at the location, as well as mask the odor from the dispensary. Proper ventilation and filtration will need to be inspected and approved by the Fire Marshal and the City Inspector to ensure that there are no adverse affects or odor from the permitted premises.

Any changes to the exterior of the building, including but not limited to façade, doors, windows, and signs will need to first be issued a "Certificate of Appropriateness" from the Historic Preservation Committee., the applicant is aware of this requirement. The applicants understand that the sign from the previous occupant will need to be removed.

RE: SUP Herbin' Infusions, 219 E Dewey Ave, Sapulpa

On October 22nd Herbin' Infusion went before the Sapulpa Planning commission to request a special use permit for a medical marijuana processing facility. The property location is 219 E Dewey Ave, what once was the Randall's Rt 66 Diner. The planning commission voted for denial based on their want to see the space utilized for retail/restaurant. As Mr. Edwards stated, "We want a business in that space that wants to be seen."

I would like to address the reasons why this particular location was chosen.

1) State Compliant

According to State Law 788 this address fulfills all requirements and is compliant. 219 E Dewey Ave is located more than 1,000ft from any schools.

2) Approval from the property owner

We discussed our plans with the owner of the property and they were supportive of the idea. They have had issues keeping the building rented as 3 business have closed in consecutive years.

3) City of Sapulpa Compliant

Before signing the lease on the property we first met with Nikki and Brittany in City Planning to discuss the location and City regulations. We were given a list of regulations for medical marijuana businesses within City limits and again found that this location was in compliance. No mention was made of unwritten regulations that the spot was only open to retail/restaurant. Had that been mentioned we would not have signed the lease and invested over \$8,000 (excluding state licensing fees). That number grows as we wait for approval. We have established a good-standing relationship with Sand Springs and hope to have the same with Sapulpa, but we are already invested in this property.

4) Department of Health Compliant

From the moment we chose to open an edible processing facility we have been working with the Creek County Department of Health. The Health Department has inspected the property and licensed it for Medical Marijuana Processing.

5) Roots in city of Sapulpa

Tyler and I live in Sapulpa, 5 of our 8 kids go to School in Sapulpa and we tithe to our church in Sapulpa. Herbin' Infusion may be wholesale, but the jobs created will help boost business in the area. We currently employ 15 workers through our other businesses and some live in Sapulpa. With the customer base Herbin' Infusions has already established, a minimum of 8 employees will be needed to start. These employees are paid a starting wage of \$12 per hour which far exceeds base pay of neighboring businesses. The higher pay allows for dining out and most employees do their shopping in town.

6) Safe location

Just as any other business with the potential to have a large amount of inventory, safety was on the top of the list when choosing our location. The close proximity to the police station and strong police presence makes this a prime location.

7) Just another business

We have been asked why we chose to set up right across from the courthouse. Tyler and I both have backgrounds in the medical field. Although we are fully aware of the stigma of the industry we view Medical Marijuana as medicine. The voters agreed with this and the State passed 788. A majority of the patients at our dispensary, The Herbin' Joint, are 50 and older and/or Veterans looking for relief without the side effects. These patients are law-abiding citizens that not only received a doctor recommendation for Medical Marijuana but an approval from the State. 



- 1) Security cameras will be mounted as follows:
- Camera 1- SE corner exterior- facing west exterior and front door
- Camera 2- SW corner interior-facing east and front door
- Camera 3- SE corner interior facing main dining area
- Camera 4- Facing NW in secondary dining area including fire exit door
- Camera 5- Facing North in the rear of kitchen including rear entrance
- Camera 6- N wall exterior- facing North to include rear entrance.

No products from commercial businesses or institutions will be accepted. The City of Sapulpa's Stormwater Department will issue vouchers to those citizens desiring to dispose of their hazardous waste at an approved Tulsa facility. The City of Sapulpa is responsible for payment for all City of Sapulpa vouchers processed by the City of Tulsa.

The contract was originally approved by the city council on September 3, 2019, but did not have an Exhibit C. The City of Tulsa has requested the contract be re-approved and signed with Exhibit C attached.

Intergovernmental Agreement for Regional Household Pollutant Collection Facility and Participation

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this ___day of ______, 2019, to be effective October 1, 2019, by and between The City of Sapulpa a municipal corporation, and The City of Tulsa, an Oklahoma municipal corporation (hereinafter referred to as "Tulsa").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties desire to enter into this Agreement to define the participation and expectations of each party and to coordinate the collection and management of household hazardous waste (HHW); and

WHEREAS, the EPA Clean Water Act of 1987 requires the establishment of Hazardous Waste Collection and Disposal Programs for MS4 permits; and

WHEREAS, HHW is "a waste which would be chemically or physically classified as a hazardous waste but is excluded from regulation as a hazardous waste pursuant to the regulations of the US Environmental Protection Agency because it is generated by a household." Such HHW consists of numerous products common to the average household, such as pesticides, paints, polishes, cleaners, and automotive supplies; and

WHEREAS, each party has determined that a regional cooperative HHW Education, Collection and Management Facility ("Facility") will provide increased convenience and participation and possibly result in cost savings to all parties to this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, each party to this Agreement has independently researched the possible benefits and obligations of participating in and coordinating activities within the Facility; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual goals and covenants contained herein, and the mutual benefits to result therefrom, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The purpose of this Agreement is to establish the process by which the City of Sapulpa may participate in the City of Tulsa's Regional HHW Collection and Management Facility to effect cost savings, increase public convenience and participation, and educate the public about the proper management of HHW.
- 2. The term of this Agreement shall commence upon the effective date set forth above and conclude June 30, 2020 (which term shall be referred to as the "Initial Term").
- 3. Either party shall have the right to terminate its participation in this Agreement for cause after giving 30 days' notice of its intent to terminate for cause to the other party, and such other party has failed to cure after a reasonable time. Grounds constituting cause include but are not limited to, failure to comply with the provisions of this Agreement, or any applicable laws, ordinances, material regulations or guidelines; one party has been unduly dilatory in executing its duties under this Agreement; or non-payment. The City of Sapulpa must meet all financial and performance commitments and other obligations up to the date of the termination. Termination shall not be effective until all financial commitments and other obligations are satisfied. Either party may terminate this Agreement without cause by giving sixty (60) days' written notice to the other.

- 4. This Agreement may be renewed beyond the Initial Term through written notification, with the approval of both the City of Tulsa and The City of Sapulpa by May 30th of the then current year. Upon such written notice, the parties will execute a renewal agreement. Each such renewal shall be for one fiscal year, July 1 to the following June 30; provided however, that if The City of Sapulpa is in arrears in payment of charges for services rendered pursuant to this Agreement the City of Sapulpa shall not be permitted to renew its participation in this Agreement until such financial obligations are paid in full.
- 5. The City of Tulsa agrees to accept HHW from Participants. The City of Tulsa will maintain an accounting of the amounts received from Participants. Each Participant will be required to produce proof of residency within the City of Sapulpa. This will be in a form agreed upon by both parties, to include voucher, current driver's license, and/or water bill. The City of Sapulpa agrees that the City of Tulsa may, but is not required to, inquire as to or investigate the residency of any person dropping off HHW. In addition, Participants will be required to comply with ordinances and policies for the disposition of HHW established by the City of Tulsa, as may be amended from time to time. It is the responsibility of the City of Tulsa to inform The City of Sapulpa of any changes to its policies within a timely manner. It is The City of Sapulpa responsibility to inform its Participants of the policies for disposition at the Facility. These policies are found in Exhibits A, B and C.
- 6. The City of Tulsa will invoice The City of Sapulpa and The City of Sapulpa will reimburse the City of Tulsa in accordance with the terms of this Agreement including Exhibit A. The City of Sapulpa hereby agrees to establish and/or encumber funding for the services to be provided under this Agreement, and to timely pay for services provided.
- 7. Payment is due thirty (30) calendar days after the date the invoice is mailed. If payment is not received by the due date, the City of Tulsa will contact The City of Sapulpa and inquire about the delinquency and inform The City of Sapulpa that payment must be made. This notification will be documented. If the payment is not received within 30 days after this notification, a ten (10%) percent late fee may be assessed to The City of Sapulpa and service to Participants under this Agreement will be subject to termination. This Agreement will only be implemented after the delinquent City of Sapulpa has been notified of the termination via email or certified letter.
- 8. The City of Tulsa shall assess a rate based on weight of HHW received from Participants delivered to the Facility. The City of Sapulpa has agreed to pay the first 45lbs at a cost of \$40 (\$0.89/lbs). Participants are responsible for weights greater than 45lbs, at a rate of \$1.33 per lbs. with payment paid directly to the City of Tulsa at the time of receipt of HHW services. Weight does not include automobile/boat/lawn equipment batteries. This rate shall be re-assessed annually by the City of Tulsa and is subject to change. Any change will be based upon the average disposal cost of the pollutants disposed of at the Facility by the City of Tulsa in addition to the annual operating costs of the Facility. The rate change will be effective upon written amendment to this Agreement signed by the parties.
- 9. Pursuant to the permit issued by the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality, the City of Tulsa is prohibited from taking certain waste that is generated at households. A list of acceptable and non-acceptable waste can be found at Exhibit B. No products from commercial businesses or institutions will be accepted; this includes waste generated by commercially exempt small quantity generators. No products from commercial vehicles or any other waste considered non-acceptable shall be accepted. It is The City of Sapulpa responsibility to inform its Participants of this policy as well as all the policies used to govern the Facility. Further, the City of Tulsa will make the final determination on any materials considered acceptable at the Facility for disposal.
 - 10. This Agreement may be amended only by written agreement signed by all parties.

- 11. All notices required to be given hereunder, shall be in writing and shall be: delivered in person (and a confirmation copy sent by first class mail); or shall be mailed by registered mail; or shall be delivered by facsimile with a return receipt showing delivery (and a confirmation copy sent by either first class mail or email), to the following addresses:

The parties may hereafter designate, in writing and as provided herein, other or different persons or addresses for receipt of notice.

- 12. When any word in this Agreement is used in the singular, it shall include the plural and the plural, the singular, except where contrary intention plainly appears. When any word is used in the masculine, it shall include the feminine, and the feminine, the masculine, except where a contrary intention plainly appears.
- 13. The parties hereto agree that it is not their intent to create any rights or benefits to any third parties and that no third party beneficiaries shall be created or shall be deemed to be created by this Agreement.
- 14. The parties hereto agree to abide by the applicable and constitutionally valid laws and rules of the City of Tulsa, State of Oklahoma and the United States of America. This Agreement is executed in and shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of State of Oklahoma without regard to its choice of law principles. The parties agree that any dispute regarding the terms or the provisions of this Agreement shall first be resolved by negotiation and mutual agreement between the parties. If the dispute is not resolved thru negotiation, the dispute shall be resolved in a court of competent jurisdiction in Tulsa County, Oklahoma.
- 15. This is the complete Agreement between the parties and no statements, representations or discussions not set forth herein shall be binding upon the parties and no party is or shall be bound by any statement or representation that does not conform to this Agreement. No agent or any party to this Agreement has authority to alter, modify or change this Agreement except as expressly provided herein. This Agreement shall be read as a whole and shall not be interpreted either for or against any party. This Agreement may only be amended in writing as approved and executed by the parties hereto.
 - 16. Time shall be deemed to be of the essence of this Agreement.

- 17. A breach of any provision of this Agreement shall be deemed to be a breach of the entire Agreement provided however the breaching party or parties shall be given thirty (30) days' notice as provided herein during which to cure any breach prior to the termination of this Agreement. The failure of any party hereto to provide notice of a breach of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver of that breach or any subsequent breach of a similar or different kind or nature.
- 18. A determination that any provision or application of any provision of this Agreement to any party is prohibited or contrary to law shall be limited to the specific language and/or party so construed and shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of the Agreement or its binding effect on any other party or parties
- 19. The parties hereto, acting under authority of their respective governing bodies, have caused this Agreement to be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original, but which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.

Exhibit A – Criteria Specific to The City of Sapulpa.

The following criteria are agreed upon and implemented with the execution of the attached Agreement between the City of Tulsa and The City of Sapulpa.

- 1. The City of Sapulpa will field requests via telephone or email, screen, and schedule appointments at the Facility to collect household hazardous waste from citizens from The City of Sapulpa.
- 2. The City of Sapulpa will work with City of Tulsa to schedule appointment of customers that are City of Sapulpa residents. This includes capturing the information that is required in order to properly schedule an appointment. Each customer scheduled by The City of Sapulpa will be issued a Sapulpa voucher. The City of Sapulpa will forward all scheduling requests to City of Tulsa, Streets and Stormwater Department for scheduling.
- 3. If the City of Sapulpa receives request to schedule appointments from Tulsa residents, The City of Sapulpa will direct the customer to contact the City of Tulsa, Streets and Stormwater Department for scheduling.
- 4. The City of Sapulpa will provide vouchers to qualified customers at their discretion in the form of codes mutually agreed to by both parties. The City of Sapulpa will inform the customer that a proof of residency and proper identification matching that of the customer to which the voucher was issued, must be presented to City of Tulsa at the time of the scheduled appointment. City of Tulsa will verify the voucher number and match the customer to the scheduled appointment. Those customers that do not have a voucher or proper identification will be charged the full fee as delineated in the Agreement with no charge to The City of Sapulpa. The City of Sapulpa is responsible for payment for all City of Sapulpa vouchers that are processed by the City of Tulsa.
 - 5. Any citizen with a City of Sapulpa voucher and a prescheduled appointment that has proper credentials will be allowed to drop off acceptable materials up to 45 pounds, excluding the weight of batteries, at no cost to them. The City of Sapulpa will be billed for the first 45lbs, which is \$40. The City of Tulsa will invoice The City of Sapulpa with the total amount for the previous month to be paid within 30 days of the invoice date. Payment will be mailed to:

- 6. Any materials in excess of 45 pounds excluding batteries will be billed to the citizen at the time of acceptance by City of Tulsa at the rate specified in the Agreement. Acceptable payment will be by major credit card only. The City of Sapulpa will instruct the customer as to the consequences of including more poundage prior to arrival at the Facility.
- 7. Tulsa will deliver to The City of Sapulpa monthly an itemized invoice in a format approved by The City of Sapulpa showing, the name and address of each customer, total number of appointments, the poundage of waste received, and amount paid by customer and the amount owed by The City of Sapulpa.

8. The City of Sapulpa shall maintain adequate records to indicate the activities undertaken pursuant to this Agreement. Such records shall be maintained at The City of Sapulpa place of business and shall be available to Tulsa during the normal business hours of The City of Sapulpa upon reasonable notice.

Appendix A - Operational Plan

Operational Plan

In accordance with OAC 252:515-3-36(a)(14) the City of Tulsa presents the following Operational Plan for:

City of Tulsa Household Pollutant Collection Facility 4502 S. Galveston Tulsa OK 74107

Introduction

This facility collects household chemicals to promote proper reuse, recycling, and disposal of waste. Many consumer products contain chemicals that may be hazardous to human health or the environment if improperly used, stored, or disposed. Unfortunately, household chemicals are frequently washed down drains, poured on the ground outside, or thrown in the trash. The City of Tulsa will handle administration, reporting, and contracts with a private disposal entity, and supervision at the collection site.

The HHW Program provides several levels of benefits to the City of Tulsa and surrounding municipalities, besides diversion of hazardous household waste from the City's municipal trash stream. The program increases safety to the City's solid waste workers, raises the community's level of awareness of household safety and hazards in the home, and alerts citizens to the contribution to nonpoint source pollution created by the improper use or disposal of used oil or other household products. Additionally the HHW Program is a requirement of the City of Tulsa's MS4 Permit #OKS000201:

(Part II(A)(6)(d)) states "...The permittee(s) shall ensure the implementation of programs to collect used motor vehicle fluids (at a minimum, oil and antifreeze) for recycle, reuse, or proper disposal and to collect household hazardous waste materials (including paint, solvents, pesticides, herbicides, and other hazardous material) for recycle, reuse, or proper disposal. Such programs shall be readily available to all private residents and shall be publicized and promoted on a regular basis."

Site Description

The Household Pollutant Collection Facility is located at 4502 S. Galveston, City of Tulsa Stormwater Land Management facility. All waste transfer, storage, and processing will take place inside a 9,000 sq. ft. building with a 50 foot buffer zone surrounding building on all sides (see Site Map Appendix D). A hazardous chemical storage container, composed of non-combustible steel, 27' long by 11' wide, equipped with dry fire suppression, adequate secondary containment, ventilation and chemical separation will be utilized inside Building 3 to contain waste material until transportation can take place.

Operational Concepts

The following operational concepts apply to the collection facility. As per the requirements of OAC 252:515-3-36(a)(14) the following operational concepts meet the requirements of Subchapter 19 (Parts 3 and 9 applicable – Parts 5, 7, 11 and 13 are not applicable see OAC 252:515-19-1):

Prohibited Waste

The following waste is prohibited from disposal at the HHPC Facility:

- Hazardous (other than HHW), radioactive or regulated PCB waste
- Regulated medical waste
- Asbestos
- Industrial or commercially generated waste (including NHIW waste)
- Putrescible waste
- Biomedical waste
- Radioactive material
- Bulky or non-hazardous waste
- Unknowns
- Ammunition/explosives
- Tires

Public Access Control

The City of Tulsa will maintain control of traffic and access to the hazardous materials segregation and packing areas at the collection facility. Security guards, signs, banner tape, traffic barricades, gates and chain link fence will all be used as site security. Onsite traffic control will involve the use of barricades, banner tape, signs, and verbal directions by on-site personnel. The City of Tulsa or designated security contractor will be requested to respond to any access control problem which may arise. Stormwater and Land Management staff employees will be on site a minimum of 8 hours per day Monday – Friday (excluding City holidays). Operational staff will be onsite Wednesday and Saturday 8 hours per day including security staff that will be limiting access to those who have scheduled appointments. Security staff also patrols the site during non-operating hours. When the facility is open to the public, residents will remain in their vehicles while transfer of waste occurs. This will minimize any exposure to residents as well as limiting access to inside Building 3.

Measuring Waste

Waste received at the Collection Facility will be temporarily placed on tables in the restricted access processing area. Segregation of the waste will occur during and after receipt of the material from the vehicles by city staff. The collected material will be classified according to its waste stream (e.g. automobile fluids, pesticides, paint etc.) and measured by weight (lbs.). All weights will be recorded and maintained in the operating record. All material will remain in this area until trained personnel can check its classification for recycle or disposal. Material then will be removed to its proper placement for repackaging. Useable chemicals will be lab-packed or bulked into DOT approved containers for transportation needs. All containers packaged with hazardous chemicals will be transferred to the proper hazardous material storage area according to hazard class (e.g., flammable, corrosive, or toxic).

Limitations on Waste Received

The Household Pollutant Collection Facility accepts only household generated hazardous waste and only in quantities in which you would expect to find in individual households. Wastes from commercial and industrial sources will not be accepted at the collection facility. Employees will also be trained on procedures for rejecting unauthorized waste at the facility — see Waste Exclusion Plan (Appendix A). The facility does not anticipate large deliveries of waste, and waste delivered in quantities greater than you would expect to find in individual households has the potential to be rejected. Per OAC 252:515-19-34 no waste greater than 200 tons of waste per day will be accepted at the facility.

Disposal Plan

Participants of the HHPCF will be required to schedule appointments for drop-off prior to delivering waste to the facility; this will also allow staff to pre-screen for unauthorized waste. Acceptable waste will be delivered to the facility by participants. Upon entering the facility, security staff will verify the contents of the drop-off and direct participants to Building 3. After entering Building 3 trained City of Tulsa staff will fill out a Waste Inspection Form (Waste Exclusion Plan - Appendix A) and transport any acceptable waste from the vehicle to the processing area where the waste will be categorized according to hazard class (i.e. corrosives, poisons, flammables) and weighed. At this time if any waste is to be rejected, participant will be notified and given options for proper disposal (see Waste Exclusion Plan Appendix A for detail on rejecting waste)

Acceptable Waste

- Automobile fluids (oil, antifreeze, brake fluid, etc.)
- Paints (latex, oil based, aerosol, stains, etc.)
- Pesticides, herbicides and fertilizers
- Flammable liquids (gasoline, paint thinner, kerosene, etc.)
- Fluorescent light bulbs
- Batteries (household and automobile)
- Electronic Waste

An estimate of the amount of waste received per day can be found below:

Planned Waste Handling and Disposal: The City of Tulsa will have advertised a request for proposal to hire a Treatment, Storage, and Disposal Facility (TSDF) contractor prior to opening the Collection Facility.

The contractor will provide an addendum to the Operational Plan. This document will provide all pertinent information regarding the contractors' permits, insurance, credentials and abilities to manage the City of Tulsa waste.

Contractor Information: A competitive selection process for a waste management contractor will be completed prior to opening the Household Chemical Collection Facility. Upon selection of a contractor, an addendum will be attached to this plan giving the credentials and insurance of the selected company.

Also City of Tulsa staff will perform site visits to any contract facility or subcontract facility utilized to dispose of material.

Provisions for Wastes Which Require Special Handling and Non-Hazardous Waste: All citizens who drop off waste will be interviewed by an onsite employee to screen for unexpected or special handling waste which may require immediate attention. Special wastes will be handled according to federal, state and local regulations. Non-regulated wastes will be recycled or disposed of in a solid waste dumpster or other equipment provided at the site.

Provisions for Classifying and Controlling Wastes: Onsite staff will conduct initial participant interviews. Trained personnel will be responsible for controlling the waste and performing any follow-up participant interviews, which may be necessary for classifying all waste materials. The following wastes will not be accepted: Radioactive, compressed gas cylinders, bio-hazardous, explosives, PCB containing materials, dioxins or highly reactive chemicals.

Provisions for Unexpected Waste: If delivery of unexpected waste occurs at the site (e.g. waste in amounts larger than expected or prohibited waste) experienced personnel will be allowed to handle waste. A special unexpected waste interim storage area will be designated on site. Unexpected waste will be stored here until transportation can occur. SDS guidelines for storage of unexpected waste will be followed if available. If contents of prohibited waste are unknown, every effort will be made to identify the unknown material. If material is identifiable, SDS precautions will be followed at that time. If material is not identifiable the material will be properly stored in the unexpected waste storage area until proper disposal can take place.

Litter Control

All waste management activities will take place inside; therefore the dispersal of litter from the site will not be conducive to wind dispersal. This includes loading and unloading of waste items. The site will be policed on a daily basis, collecting any litter as needed. Signs will be posted to advise customers to adequately cover/secure their loads to prevent litter from leaving the site.

Air Criteria

Operations at the facility will be conducted in a manner to maintain compliance with the Oklahoma Clean Air Act, rules of the Air Quality Division of DEQ and any requirements of an approved State Implementation Plan. Open burning of solid waste is strictly prohibited at the facility. It is unexpected that activities at the facility would increase the amount of fugitive dust from the property. However, if ever shown to be the case, operations at the facility will be modified in a manner to prevent any visible fugitive dust emissions beyond the property boundary, at which time the DEQ will be notified. Asbestos of any kind will not be accepted at the facility. However, if unavoidable delivery of asbestos/friable asbestos occurs the material will be handled in accordance with OAC 252:100-40-5.

Disease Vector Control

The proposed facility will not be accepting putrescible waste, therefore on site disease vectors, if present, will be minimal. All waste will be stored inside, so as not to allow standing water for mosquito proliferation. Bird deterrents are present in facility and consist of nesting/roosting barriers and high frequency noise emissions. All other disease vectors will be controlled on an as needed basis using techniques appropriate for the protection of human health and the environment.

Placement of Waste

All waste storage, processing and management activities will take place inside the facility until transportation can take place. Adequate indoor storage area is available should delivery of unexpected

volumes occur. Therefore no waste will be exposed to waters of the state or waters that communicate with waters from the state either inside the permit boundary, buffer zone or outside the permit boundary (see Site Map Appendix D) for a diagram of permit boundary and buffer zone).

Salvage and Recycling

See Appendix J for a plan detailing salvage and recycling operations at the facility.

Recordkeeping and Reporting

An operating record will be maintained at the facility containing all records concerning the planning, construction, operation, closing and post-closure monitoring of the facility as applicable. Such records will be maintained until the post-closure monitoring period is terminated and shall include those records required to be maintained and/or submitted to DEQ by Subchapter 29 of Chapter 15 (OAC 252:515-29-4) as well as those records required to be maintained and/or submitted to DEQ by Subchapters 3, 5, 17, 19, 25 and 27 (OAC 252:515-19-40). Information to be maintained as part of the operating record at the facility includes but is not limited to:

- An entire copy of the Tier II Transfer Station Permit under which the facility operates, including any and all associated documents required by the DEQ for pennit approval
- Verification of Location Restrictions as required by Subchapter 5 of OAC 252:515
- A copy of the approved Stormwater Management Plan as required by Subchapter 17 of OAC 252:515
- A copy of the approved Operational Plan as required by Subchapter 19 of OAC 252:515
- A copy of the approved Closure Plan as required by Subchapter 25 of OAC 252:515
- A copy of the Waste Exclusion Plan as required by Subchapter 29 (OAC 252:515-29-4)
 - o All waste accepted for disposal at the facility will be weighed, recorded and maintained in the operating record
 - o Any employee training including training to demonstration compliance with the Waste Exclusion Plan as required by Subchapter 29 of OAC 252:515
 - o Waste Inspection Forms for every drop-off transaction
 - o Any waste identified and rejected including personal information on participant maintaining ownership of rejected waste
 - Waste Management Facility Evaluation for any contractor or sub-contractor utilized for disposal of waste
- Waste Hauler Manifests for each load transported out of the facility which includes type and weight of waste transported
- Site Inspection Forms to be completed at the end of each operational day.

Processing Time for Putrescible Waste

The facility will not be accepting putrescible waste of any kind. Staff will be trained to screen/reject putrescible waste, and the site will be patrolled by security staff during off hours. However, if unavoidable delivery of putrescible waste to the proposed processing facility occurs, the waste will be processed within 24 hours by disposing in our normal solid waste service to the site.

Large or Bulky Items

Large and bulky items not suitable for facility operations will not be accepted at the proposed facility. Staff will be trained to screen for this type of waste, and the site will be patrolled by security staff during off hours. However, if unavoidable delivery of large or bulky items occurs, the waste will be processed by the next business day by pickup of the City of Tulsa's illegal dumping crew.

Residue Management

All processed waste and residues produced at the facility will be determined to be hazardous/non-hazardous and will be disposed of in a properly permitted disposal facility. Hazardous waste will be disposed of by the contracted treatment, storage and waste disposal company. Non-hazardous waste will be disposed of through municipal waste trash service to the facility. Only household generated waste (whether hazardous or non-hazardous) will be disposed of through the services of the facility, any additional trash generated by other operations occurring on the 12.62 acre Stormwater and Land Management facility will be kept separate accordingly. Site Inspection Forms will be completed at the end of each day of operation. The purpose of these inspections is to ensure that no spill, leak or material has unexpectedly occurred and that all material is stored properly and securely at the end of operations. A copy of the Site Inspection form is included at the end of this plan.

Discussion and possible action regarding an Ordinance of the City of Sapulpa, Oklahoma, Amending the Sapulpa City Code, Part 13, Public Safety, Chapter 2, Fire Department and Service, Article B, Calls Outside Limits, by Amending Sections 13-206 thru 13-210, Providing Authorization for Medical Response Calls in Outside Fire Run District; Providing for Contract Terms and Fees; Providing for Repealer and Severability; and Declaring an Emergency.

BACKGROUND:

The proposed Code amendments follow from recent Study Session discussions about authorizing the Sapulpa fire department to respond to calls for emergency medical response to areas outside city limits but within the department's Outside Fire Run territory. The proposed changes to the City Code would authorize and allow city fire to respond to such calls within the Outside Fire Run District, and includes basic emergency medical response within the services provided by the department under its Outside Fire Run Services agreement. These changes to the Code are required in order to authorize provision of the requested services outside city limits.

RECOMMENDATION:

To authorize and provide medical response services outside city limits, staff recommends that the City Council adopt the attached Ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAPULPA, OKLAHOMA, AMENDING THE SAPULPA CITY CODE, PART 13, PUBLIC SAFETY, CHAPTER 2, FIRE DEPARTMENT AND SERVICE, ARTICLE B, CALLS OUTSIDE LIMITS, BY AMENDING SECTIONS 13-206 THRU 13-210, PROVIDING AUTHORIZATION FOR MEDICAL RESPONSE CALLS IN OUTSIDE FIRE RUN DISTRICT; PROVIDING FOR CONTRACT TERMS AND FEES; PROVIDING FOR REPEALER AND SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAPULPA, OKLAHOMA, THAT:

<u>Section 1.</u> Part 13, Chapter 2, Article B of the Sapulpa City Code is hereby amended by amending and replacing Sections 13-206 thru 13-210 with the following language to read in its entirety, as follows:

"ARTICLE B

CALLS OUTSIDE LIMITS

SECTION 13-206 CONTRACTS AUTHORIZED OUTSIDE CITY LIMITS.

- A. The City is hereby authorized and empowered to enter into contracts or agreements with individuals, firms, private corporations or associations, or political subdivisions of the State for fire protection, fire prevention and first responder rescue, resuscitation, first aid and basic life support services, outside the corporate limits of the City (collectively "Outside Fire Run Services"), and to contract to provide such services jointly with other organizations and municipal subdivisions of the State in furnishing, maintaining, and operating fire equipment for outside aid or mutual aid upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be in the best interest of the contracting parties.
- B. The contract specified in the preceding subsection may be entered into by the City Clerk on behalf of the City when furnished satisfactory evidence that the person has in force with a reputable insurance company a policy of insurance providing for the payment of a minimum sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) to the City for fire protection services. The contract shall be executed by the City Clerk only after approval by the Fire Chief or his deputy who shall endorse his approval on the contract when satisfied that the City can afford such protection to the property covered thereby without foreseeable or hazardous lessening of the fire protection to the property within the City, giving consideration to the location of the property, its accessibility and other facts which might enter into the making

of a response to the location requesting **Outside Fire Run Services**. [Prior Code, Secs. 10-12 - 10-14]

State Law Reference: Mutual aid, fire contracts outside limits, 11 O.S. §§ 29-106 to 29-109.

SECTION 13-207 CONTRACT TERMS, FEES FOR SERVICE.

Any contract entered into by the City with an individual owner, firm, private corporation, or association, for **Outside Fire Run Services**, outside aid, and/or mutual aid for fire protection, shall provide for the payment by the owner, firm, private corporation, or association, or political subdivision to the City for such fire apparatus and personnel and for annual contracts at the rates and charges as set by Master Fee Schedule. All monies received from the calls shall go into the general fund or fire pension fund, all as may be directed by the City Council.

SECTION 13-208 AUTHORITY TO ANSWER CALLS.

The fire department of the City is hereby authorized to answer calls for **Outside Fire Run Services** within the area enclosed by the outside corporate limits of the City, or when the location for such service is within the City E911 emergency response area. In the event such a call is answered on a location without an annual contract for Outside Fire Services, the property owner of the location responded to shall be obligated to pay the charges and fees set forth in the Master Fee Schedule. The Fire Chief, however, is authorized to refuse to make such runs or to prevent the use of fire fighting personnel and equipment when in his judgment it is not expedient to do so on account of (i) emergency response needs within the City, (ii) broken or insufficient apparatus or equipment, (iii) dangerous roadways or access, and/or (iv) any other condition which in the opinion of the Chief makes it necessary to hold back firefighting equipment and personnel for protection of lives and property within the City.

SECTION 13-209 FIREFIGHTERS SERVING IN REGULAR LINE OF DUTY.

All firefighters of the fire department of the City attending, serving and rendering **Outside Fire Run Services** work outside the corporate limits of the City, as herein provided, shall be considered as serving in their regular line of duty as fully as if they were serving within the corporate limits of the City. The firefighters shall be entitled to all the benefits of any firemen's pension and relief fund in the same manner as if the fire fighting, fire prevention and/or first responder work was being done within the corporate limits of the City.

SECTION 13-210 DEPARTMENT CONSIDERED AGENT OF STATE.

All firefighters of the fire department of the City attending, serving, and rendering **Outside Fire Run Services** work outside the corporate limits of the City, as herein provided, shall be considered as serving in their regular line of duty as fully as if they

were serving within the corporate limits of the City. The firefighters shall be entitled to all the benefits of any firefighters' pension and relief fund in the same manner as if the fire fighting, fire prevention and/or first responder work was being done within the corporate limits of the City."

<u>Section 2.</u> All parts of any ordinance or resolution in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of conflict only.

<u>Section 3.</u> If any part or parts of this ordinance are held invalid or ineffective, the remaining portion shall not be affected but remain in full force and effect.

Section 4. EMERGENCY. Being immediately necessary that the provisions of this ordinance be put into full force and effect for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City of Sapulpa, Oklahoma, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

Discussion and possible action regarding An Ordinance of the City of Sapulpa, Oklahoma, Amending the Master Fee Schedule to the Sapulpa City Code, Appendix A, by Repealing and Replacing Section 13.13-207/13-208; Providing Rates for Outside Fire Run Fees; Providing for an Effective Date; and Providing for Repealer and Severability.

BACKGROUND:

The standard annual fee of \$150 for Outside Fire Run services has not been adjusted in nearly 10 years. Increasing the scope of services to include emergency medical response would also justify considering an adjustment to this fee to compensate for the costs associated with providing such additional services. In addition, staffs review of the matter has revealed that many of the listed fees in the current Code are not applied or collected; as such, the rather complex rate structure should be simplified and revised to comport with actual departmental practice. Accordingly, the proposed ordinance simplifies the t Outside Fire Run Fee structure by essentially creating 2 categories: Non-Industrial (residential/commercial properties) at a rate of \$200 per year and Industrial properties with no change to the fee.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends Council approve Ordinance and authorize the Mayor to execute same.

Section 1. The Sapulpa City Code, Appendix A, Section 13.13-207/13-208, is amended by repealing and replacing Section 13.13-207/13-208 with the following:

"SECTION 13.13-207/13-208

OUTSIDE FIRE RUN FEES.

The fees referenced in Section 13-207 and 13-208 are as follows:

- A. \$675.00 per hour for each piece of apparatus, with minimum one hour billed; thereafter \$168.75 per 1/4 hour of each piece of apparatus.
- B. In lieu of this charge, an owner or resident may contract for services from the fire department on an annual basis as set forth as follows:

1. Residential/Commercial: \$200.00

2. Industrial Rate: 2,000 sq. ft. and under: \$600.00

2,000 sq. ft to 7,500 sq. ft.: \$1,200.00 Each additional 5,000 sq. ft.: \$600.00

[Rates above applicable to each structure on property up to max \$5,000 per business.]

3. Mobile Home Park: Each occupied space: \$150.00

4. Unimproved Land: Single parcel: \$150.00

[Provided that any Outside Fire Run to property owned by a public agency without a mutual aid agreement with the City shall be charged at a rate of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) per run.]"

Section 2. Effective Date. The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective and in full force and effect on January 1, 2020.

BACKGROUND:

The Sapulpa City Charter requires an election every two years for the purpose of electing one of the two City Councilors from each of the five Wards of the City to a four year term. The Charter also requires that state election law be followed in terms of timing and notice of said elections. The five (5) Ward seats that are up for election in 2020 are:

- (A) Ward One, Seat Two, currently held by Wes Galloway;
- (B) Ward Two, Seat Two, currently held by John Anderson;
- (C) Ward Three, Seat Two, currently held by Marty Cummins;
- (D) Ward Four, Seat Two, currently held by Reg Green;
- (E) Ward Five, Seat Two, currently held by Hugo Naifeh.

WHEREAS, the Sapulpa City Charter Article X requires elections to be held every two years in the City of Sapulpa for the purpose of electing City Councilors of the City; and

WHEREAS, Title 26, Oklahoma Statutes 2012, Section 13-102, as amended, requires the City of Sapulpa, Oklahoma, to give sixty (60) days' notice by resolution of said election to the Creek County Election Board, stating therein the date of said elections and other information necessary for conducting such elections; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAPULPA, OKLAHOMA:

Section 1. That for the purpose of electing City Councilors to a four-year term of office for the City of Sapulpa, Oklahoma:

- (D) Ward Four, Seat Two, currently held by Reg Green;

Section 3. That each candidate for office shall be a registered voter; further, they shall be bona fide residents of the City of Sapulpa for not less than one year immediately preceding their nomination and bona fide residents of the ward in which they are seeking office for not less than six months immediately preceding their nomination.

Section 4. That to become a candidate for such election, a declaration of candidacy must be filed with the Creek County Election Board no earlier than 8:00 A.M. December 2, 2019, and no later than 5:00 P.M. December 4, 2019, with a contest period of December 5, 2019 and ending December 6, 2019.

Section 5. That the number, location and hours of operation of the polling places for said elections shall be the same as the regular precinct polling places as designated for statewide and local elections by the Creek County Election Board, except that the City certifies that no one resides within the following precincts, and therefore to the extent closure is authorized by state law, the following precincts can be closed for said election:

Precinct No. 190415; Precinct No. 190416; and Precinct No. 190420

Section 6. That only the registered, qualified voters of the City of Sapulpa, Oklahoma, may vote upon the election of officers as above set forth; and that the returns of said elections shall be made to and canvassed by the Creek County Election Board. That the Creek County Election Board shall be notified of such elections by receipt of a copy of this Resolution and a map of current ward boundaries of the City.

Washington Recreation Center, including road access improvements and acquire necessary property and lands therefor; and to construct, equip and improve the Sapulpa Youth Sports Complex, recreation and park facilities and acquire necessary property and lands therefor; and

WHEREAS, the estimated amount necessary for the City to acquire, construct, reconstruct, extend, enlarge, improve and repair streets and bridges within said City is the sum of Ten Million Six Hundred Forty Thousand and no/100s Dollars (\$10,640,000.00); and the amount necessary to acquire, construct, reconstruct, improve, remodel and repair public safety buildings and facilities and acquiring necessary lands therefor and purchase and install public safety equipment is the sum of Five Million Seven Hundred Eighty Five Thousand and no/100s Dollars (\$5,785,000.00); and the amount necessary to purchase, construct, equip, improve, extend and beautify public parks and park lands and recreational facilities is the sum of Three Million Ninety Thousand and no/100s Dollars (\$3,090,000.00); and the amount necessary to provide funds for economic development or community development purposes within or near the City, and acquire necessary property and lands therefor, is the sum of Four Million and no/100s Dollars (\$4,000,000.00); and the amount necessary to construct, equip, replace and improve the Booker T. Washington Recreation Center, including road access improvements and acquire necessary property and lands therefor is the sum of Eight Million Five Hundred Thousand and no/100s Dollars (\$8,500,000.00); and the amount necessary to construct, equip and improve the Sapulpa Youth Sports Complex, recreation and park facilities, and acquire necessary property and lands therefor, is the sum of Eight Million Two Hundred Twenty Thousand and no/100s Dollars (\$8,220,000.00); and

WHEREAS, there are no funds in the treasury for such purposes, and power is granted said City by Section 27, Article X, of the Constitution, Section 35, Article X, of the Constitution and statutes of the State of Oklahoma, and acts complementary, supplementary and enacted pursuant thereto, to issue bonds to provide funds for such purposes, provided the same be authorized by the registered qualified voters thereof, voting at an election held for such purpose; and

WHEREAS, Title 26, Oklahoma Statutes 2019, Section 13-103, as amended, requires the City to list any precincts only partially contained within the limits of the municipality and in which no one resides within the portion of precinct within the limits of the municipality, and to designate whether such precincts shall be opened or closed for such elections; and

WHEREAS, Precinct No. 190416, Precinct No. 190420 and Precinct No. 190422 are each only partially contained within the limits of the City of Sapulpa and no one resides within the portion of these precincts that lie within the municipal limits of the City, and the City desires that these unoccupied precincts remain closed for such election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAPULPA, STATE OF OKLAHOMA.

Section 1. That the Mayor of said City be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to call a special election to be held in said City on the 14h day of January, 2020 for the purpose of submitting to the registered qualified voters thereof the following propositions:

PROPOSITION #4

That the ballots shall set forth the propositions to be voted upon substantially as set out in Section 1 hereof, and that the timing, holding, and certification of said election shall be conducted in compliance with applicable state law. The number and location of the polling places for said election shall be the same as the regular precinct polling places as designated for statewide and local elections by the Creek County Election Board, except that precincts Nos. 190416, 190420 and 190422, which are each only partially contained within the limits of the City and which have no one residing within the portion of those precincts within the limits of the municipality, shall not be opened but remain closed for the election authorized by this Resolution. The persons who shall conduct said election shall be those officers designated by the Creek County Election Board, which officers shall also act as counters and certify the election as required by law. The approval of the propositions shall require a simple 50% plus one vote majority.
