Mr. David Beyer addressed the council and requested the vote to call a bond election be delayed. He expressed concern that the proposals as presented would not be approved by the citizens.

Mr. Tim Colbert Grant, former city councilor, spoke to the council about Booker T. Washington Community Center not being demolished. The building should be remodeled or an extension added to it.

Motion was made by Councilor Hugo Naifeh, seconded by Councilor Carla Gunn, to delay the adoption of the resolution, and it to be brought back for consideration for the next available election date.

## STATUTES OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA, AND ACTS COMPLEMENTARY SUPPLEMENTARY AND ENACTED PURSUANT THERETO; AND IN CONNECTION WITH EACH OF SAID BONDS, THE QUESTION OF LEVYING AND COLLECTING AN ANNUAL TAX, IN ADDITION TO ALL OTHER TAXES, UPON ALL THE TAXABLE PROPERTY IN SAID CITY FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE INTEREST AND PRINCIPAL ON SAID BONDS.

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable by the City of Sapulpa, State of Oklahoma, to acquire, construct, reconstruct, extend, enlarge, improve and repair streets and bridges; to acquire, construct, reconstruct, improve, remodel and repair public safety buildings and facilities and acquiring necessary lands therefor and purchase and install public safety equipment; to purchase, construct equip, improve, extend and beautify public parks and park lands and recreational facilities; to provide funds for economic development or community development purposes within or near the City, and acquire necessary property and lands therefor; to construct, equip, replace and improve the Booker T. Washington Recreation Center, including road access improvements and acquire necessary property and to construct, equip and improve the Sapulpa Youth Sports Complex, recreation and park facilities and acquire necessary property and lands therefor; and

WHEREAS, the estimated amount necessary for the City to acquire, construct, reconstruct, extend, enlarge, improve and repair streets and bridges within said City is the sum of Ten Million Six Hundred Forty Thousand and no/100s Dollars (\$10,640,000.00); and the amount necessary to acquire, construct, reconstruct, improve, remodel and repair public safety buildings and facilities and acquiring necessary lands therefor and purchase and install public safety equipment is the sum of Five Million Six Hundred Thirty Five Thousand and no/100s Dollars (\$5,635,000.00); and the amount necessary to purchase, construct, equip, improve, extend and beautify public parks and park lands and recreational facilities is the sum of Three Million Ninety Thousand and no/100s Dollars (\$3,090,000.00); and the amount necessary to provide funds for economic development or community development purposes within or near the City, and acquire necessary property and lands therefor, is the sum of Four Million and no/100s Dollars (\$4,000,000.00); and the amount necessary to construct, equip, replace and improve the Booker T. Washington Recreation Center, including road access improvements and acquire necessary property and lands therefor is the sum of Eight Million Five Hundred Thousand and no/100s Dollars (\$8,500,000.00); and the amount necessary to construct, equip and improve the Sapulpa Youth Sports Complex, recreation and park facilities, and acquire necessary property and lands therefor, is the sum of Eight Million Two Hundred Twenty Thousand and no/100s Dollars (\$8,220,000.00); and

WHEREAS, there are no funds in the treasury for such purposes, and power is granted said City by Section 27, Article X, of the Constitution, Section 35, Article X, of the Constitution and statutes of the State of Oklahoma, and acts complementary, supplementary and enacted pursuant thereto, to issue bonds to provide funds for such purposes, provided the same be authorized by the registered qualified voters thereof, voting at an election held for such purpose; and

**WHEREAS**, Title 26, Oklahoma Statutes 2019, Section 13-103, as amended, requires the City to list any precincts only partially contained within the limits of the municipality and in which no one resides within the portion of precinct within the limits of the municipality, and to designate whether such precincts shall be opened or closed for such elections; and

**WHEREAS**, Precinct No. 190416, Precinct No. 190420 and Precinct No. 190422 are each only partially contained within the limits of the City of Sapulpa and no one resides within the portion of these precincts that lie within the municipal limits of the City, and the City desires that these unoccupied precincts remain closed for such election.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAPULPA, STATE OF OKLAHOMA.

Section 1. That the Mayor of said City be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to call a special election to be held in said City on the 12th day of November, 2019, for the purpose of submitting to the registered qualified voters thereof the following propositions:
